CSR PROJECTS & VOLUNTEERING



Education & Technology

In fiscal year 2023, we allocated **33% of our funding towards educational and technological initiatives**, which included the FLN (Foundational, Literacy & Numeracy) Program, Grama Digi Vikasana, and Science Kit Distribution in partnership with the Sikshana Foundation, as well as school kit distribution in collaboration with Seva Sahayog.



Health & Human Services

43% of our funding was dedicated to health and human services, supporting infrastructure for the Bangalore Medical Services Trust's blood bank, a mobile healthcare unit in Shirwal through HelpAge, and health camps and disability support provided by Samarthanam Trust in Bangalore.



Volunteering

Last year, a total of **15 volunteering events** were organized in India (Bangalore and Pune), engaging over **600 participants** who contributed **1000 hours** to community related causes, engaging in activities that ranged from spending quality time with children to raising awareness about 7,000 rare diseases.

Their efforts included providing laptops to those in need, organizing blood donation drives that helped save lives, holding health camps, delivering STEM sessions for children, planting trees, and inaugurating new infrastructure projects.

Our volunteers demonstrated commitment to these initiatives, willingly dedicating their time and support beyond regular work hours.



Environment & Sustainability

15% of the funding was contributed towards environmental initiatives, including solar-powered home lighting systems for rural and urban households through the Selco Foundation, Seva Sahayog.



Professional Development

9% to Professional Development programs that offered training for women and individuals with disabilities through the WinVinaya Foundation.

SIKSHANA FOUNDATION

Foundational Literacy & Numeracy Program & Grama Digi Vikasana

- Through the FLN Program, the Sikshana Foundation is working on improving the foundational language and mathematical skills of students studying in government schools, using workbooks.
- The Program is on the lines of the National Initiative for Proficiency in Reading with Understanding and Numeracy (NIPUN) Bharat's objective, to enable every child to attain foundational literacy and numeracy by the end of Grade 3 by the year 2026-27.
- Through this project the foundation enables all Government school students in the areas of operation, Devanahalli and Kengeri Taluk in Bangalore district, Karnataka, to achieve Foundational Literacy and Numeracy competencies by the end of 2027.
- The Grama Digi Vikasana is one of the digital inclusion program focused on enabling the existing libraries managed by the rural development panchayat raj (RDPR) with digital devices with the integrated e-resource to build a digital knowledge hub and provide a digital learning experience for the rural youth and community and thus bridge the digital divide among the urban and the rural population.









Employability training for Persons with Disabilities

- The primary objective of the project is to offer free training and placement support to a total of 50 candidates, with a focus on women and persons with disabilities. The training encompassed Financial Accounting and Software Testing skills, aiming to enhance their employability and facilitate job placement of 25 candidates out of 50.
- The project achieved a balanced gender diversity with 48% women and 52% men participating overall.



Support for Solar Home Lighting systems in urban & rural communities

- SELCO Foundation and TE Connectivity have joined forces to bring transformative change to underserved communities across India. This innovative partnership builds on providing solar home lighting solutions and TE Connectivity's commitment to sustainable technology. The initiative aims to illuminate the lives of those living without access to modern energy services, reducing energy poverty, improving livelihoods, and fostering sustainable development. Together, these organizations are poised to brighten the future of urban slums and rural communities, one light at a time.
- The Solar Home Lighting project directly impacted an estimated 2000 individuals across various communities. 611 families were direct beneficiaries, transitioning from kerosene lamps to sustainable solar lighting solutions. The positive impact extended to nearly 2000 individuals, including daily workers and students, who now experience an improved quality of life due to the deployment of solar home lighting systems.

BANGALORE MEDICAL SERVICES TRUST (BMST)

Equipment Support for BMST

- TE Connectivity supported the operations at Bangalore Medical Services Trust (BMST) by donating medical equipment to boost its blood bank infrastructure. The donated medical equipment included two blood bank refrigerators, a consumables refrigerator, and two HLA lab centrifuges.
- HLA laboratory is one of the foremost testing facilities in India which carries out around 3000 p.a., pre and post-transplant tests for both Bone Marrow Transplant as well as solid organ-Kidney, heart, liver- transplants.
- The total number of patients benefitted from the donated equipment is close to 18559.

Mobile Healthcare Unit

- The Mobile Health service from HelpAge provides affordable and quality primary healthcare services at the doorstep of the needy elderly and their community.
- The Mobile Healthcare Unit (MHU) in Shirwal, Pune covers 17 operational sites as per the weekly schedule. The current MHU has been working towards the wellbeing of the Shirwal community since October 2018 with the support of TE Connectivity.
- In the last quarter total 9506 (Male- 3374 & Female - 6132) treatments were conducted by the Mobile Healthcare Unit.
- 6 Beneficiaries were referred to Hospital/Pathology labs for further investigation through MHU referral services.
- 12 Special Health Camp (Cataract Camp) & 84 Cataract Surgeries were done till September 2023 from HV Desai Hospital, Pune.

SAMARTHANAM TRUST

Health camps & disability support - Devanahalli

- The primary objective of the project was to provide quality health services to Person with Disabilities (PWDs) and marginalized communities, train the parents on rehabilitation management, and rehabilitate and enable the PWDs to lead their lives independently.
- At the end of the project Samarthanam successfully provided 280 UDI cards for Persons with Disabilities. The beneficiaries from homes to referral hospitals. General physicians, psychiatrists, clinical psychologists, and audiologists conducted various assessments to measure the degree of disability. After the assessment online applications were submitted and ensured getting the UDID for the needy.
- Samarthanam Trust in association with the Primary Health Center of BK Halli and BK Halli Panchayath, organized a Menstrual Hygiene workshop for the adolescent girl students of Baglur Govt. school. The awareness workshop conducted by Mrs. Shashikala, Community Health Officer (CHO), educated 70 adolescent girls on the issues of menstrual hygiene and safe practices. Adding on to the training program for parents and caregivers in which 53 parents and caregivers participated, 210 sanitary pads were distributed.

Impact

2500 individuals benefited from Health and Eye camps, UDID camp, Menstrual hygiene awareness programs through home visits, assistive device interventions medicine distribution.

Education, Infrastructure & Environment



School Kit Distribution -

A school kit (including a school bag, pens, pencils, a drawing book, colors, and a compass box) was provided to underprivileged children in aided and unaided schools, as well as educational centers run by NGOs across Maharashtra. Within this project, school kits were distributed to 1000 students from Zilla Parishad schools in rural areas, with the participation of 45 TE employees at the distribution activity.



Blanket & Walking Stick Distribution -

Walking sticks were provided to 90 senior citizens, and blankets were distributed to 70 underprivileged farm workers from Bori Village.



Maintenance of Biogas Plant -

Matoshree Old Age Home faced difficulties in cooking food as they relied on fuel for cooking. The biogas plant installed on the premises for this purpose was not functioning properly. With the maintenance of the biogas project, servicing of the biogas plant was carried out, resulting in its restoration and functionality. Furthermore, the storage lockers at the facility were damaged. Under this project, nine locker storages were donated to them.



Beautification of Zilla Parishad School Palshi -

There was a need for beautification at the Zilla Parishad School in Palshi, focusing on both internal and external walls. The objective was to utilize classroom walls for educational purposes. As part of this initiative, various animals, birds, and plants were painted on the school's walls to create an immersive experience of nature for the students.



Sports Uniform distribution -

Students in rural areas come from diverse economic backgrounds, often unable to afford sports uniforms. As part of this project, 210 sports uniforms were distributed to students at Zilla Parishad School Shirwal. The students were thrilled to receive these uniforms and proudly wore them during the school's Independence Day celebration on 15th August 2023.


